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


# Outcomes of COP19 on Market Mechanisms and the JCM

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### Road to the post 2020 framework



#### **Decisions on the CDM**

- ◆Request of guidance to the CDM EB
  - Development of SD monitoring tool
  - Analysis of validation of monitoring plan for microscale and PoA projects
  - Development of country-specific baseline and additionality thresholds
  - Review the concept of materiality in the verification process
- Review of the modalities and procedures for the CDM
  - ✓ Continue to work on SBI40 since many issues remains
    to be discussed
  - ✓ Request the secretariat to prepare a technical paper for seven issues.

### Current status of Joint Crediting Mechanism


- 10 countries have signed the bilateral documents.
  - Mongolia, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Kenya, Maldives, Viet Nam, Lao PDR, Indonesia, Costa Rica and Palau

To designate Third Party Entities

To hold 1st Joint Committee between Japan and Lao PDR

## Financial incentives for the JCM project

The JAPANESE participant(s) can apply for the one of the following subsidies and receive it upfront:

MOEJ (GEC): no more than half of the initial installation cost of the equipment, in return for GHG emission reduction to the government of JAPAN.

Note: There is also financial support scheme by METI.

Note: METI stands for Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry; MoEJ for The Ministry of the Environment.

### Way forward

- Framework for Various Approach would include transaction of units/outcomes under the JCM.
- The JCM is a new mechanism which incentivizes low carbon technology in developing countries.
- Implementation of rule and guidelines and project identification for the JCM are to be proceeded.
